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Neuropsychological assessment of ability to work

In a neuropsychological assessment, a person's emotional life, capability to process information, and activity in relation to their occupational history and profession or possible educational plan is evaluated. During the assessment, the examinee is interviewed, and his/her cognitive performance is evaluated with different kinds of evaluation methods. Additionally, the examinee's actions during the assessment are observed and the relevant background information is utilized.

On the basis of the neuropsychological assessment, the ability to work, capability to study, and everyday functioning are evaluated and the necessary follow-up recommendations are given. The results and recommendations of the evaluation are recorded into the statement of the neuropsychological assessment. After the assessment, there is a feedback conversation with the examinee. In the conversation, the findings of the assessment and their impact on everyday life, educational opportunities and ability to work are gone over carefully together with the examinee.
